Shab-e-Rang o Ahang

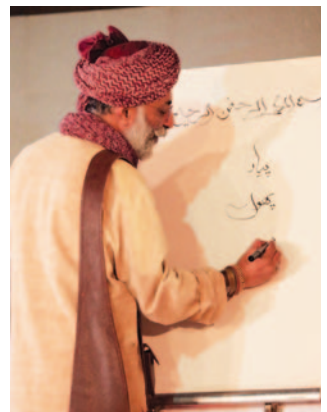

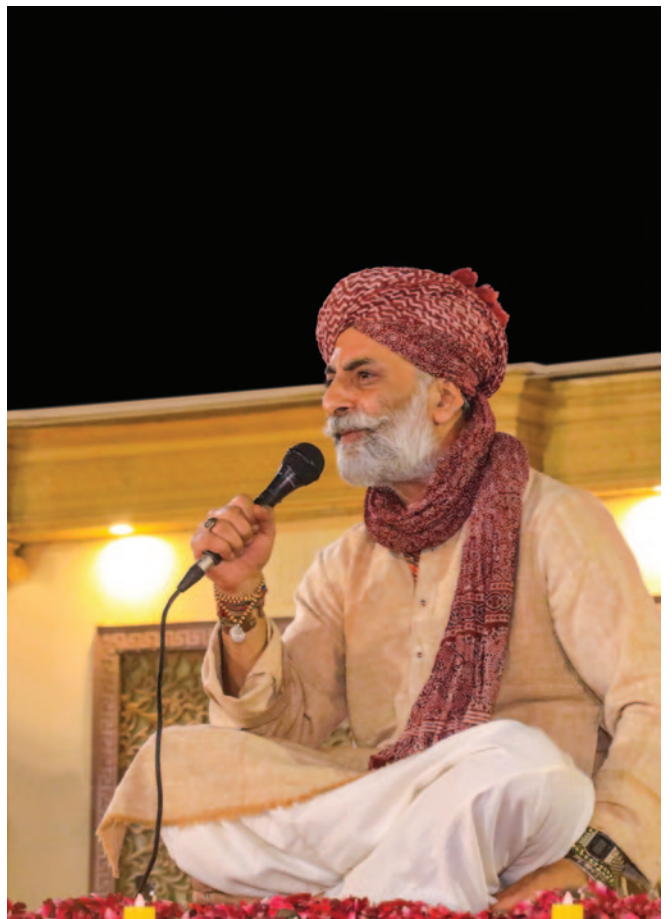

This litter can easily become entangled and get caught around the necks, beaks, feet, wings, flippers, and fins of marine animals, choking the poor animals or affecting their mobility and ability to catch food to feed.

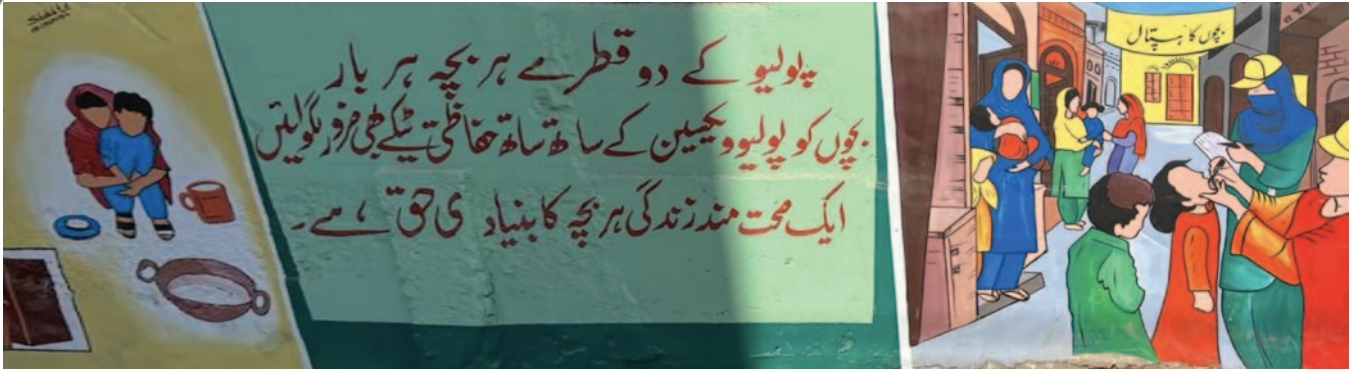

Mr. Ali Jillani faculty of Greenwich University discussed the violation of the Geneva Convention and the UN resolutions on the Kashmir dispute by Indian forces in Indian-occupied Kashmir. The speakers criticized the Indian government over none presence of media in Indian-Occupied Kashmir and where internet services are also cut down. Speakers of the rally were concerned about the leaders for the freedom of Kashmir and the innocent villagers who have been jailed by the Indian army. Speakers along with the participant of the rally raised slogans against Indian forces who were not allowing journalists and observers to visit the areas in which they are committing severe human rights violations and rape of Kashmiri women.

The organizer of the rally and Chairman of the World Kashmir Forum Haji Muhammad Rafiq Pardesi said that Kashmir should be given their right to self-determination as per



Wall Painting for Polio Eradication



Polio is an illness caused by a virus that mainly affects nerves in the spinal cord or brain stem. In its most severe form, polio can lead to a person being unable to move certain limbs, also called paralysis. It can also lead to trouble breathing and sometimes death.

People carrying the poliovirus even people who don't get sick can pass along the virus in feces or droplets from sneezing or coughing. The virus enters another person through the mouth. The virus can spread easily. For example, the virus can spread if people haven't washed their hands after coughing, using the toilet, or before eating. The virus also may be in water contaminated with feces carrying the poliovirus.

As of the end of December 2022, there have been 20 documented cases in Pakistan. There was 1 documented case in Pakistan in 2021 and 84 documented cases in Pakistan in 2020. The total count of wild poliovirus cases in Pakistan in 2019 was 147. Pakistan and Afghanistan are the only two countries in the world where Polio is still found and both countries are a threat to the rest of the world in spreading the Polio Virus.

Creating public awareness of the deadly disease and giving Polio drops to all children up to the age of 5 years is the only solution to stop the spread of the disease. The students of the



course Technology and Social Change (GHSC – 755) under the supervision of their course in-charge Dr. Tahira Tariq created a Wall Painting Activity for creating public awareness regarding Polio. An activity was scheduled on Saturday, 22 December 2022 at Marwat Dispensary in Bilal Colony Korangi, Karachi.

The objective of organizing the Wall Painting Activity was to engage youth, parents, and local bodies to create awareness among people regarding providing Polio drops to children. Students, faculty, and the locals of the area were invited to





witness the occasion. Dr. Abdul Hayee Khoso the district health officer of Korangi and Dr. Kaleem Sheikh NStop Officer District of Korangi was the guest at the event.

On the event day, a large number of students, faculty, and the general public visited the site where they were briefed about Polio disease. Visitors were encouraged to paint the before-hand drawings with their own hands

using different colors thus practically becoming a part of the Polio eradication campaign. The locals of the area were very much delighted and happy after doing the paint job and getting health awareness.

Dr. Abdul Hayee Khoso appreciated the student's efforts in creating health awareness and applauded Greenwich University for their support. Dr. Kaleem Sheikh stressed the need of creating public awareness to reduce the incidence of diseases in the general public.

In the end, Dr. Tahira Tariq thanked the honorable guests and handed over souvenirs as a token of appreciation for joining



the event. Dr. Sabir Ahmed Head of the Department of Media Art & Design at Greenwich University thanked University for providing practical learning opportunities to the students. The event ended with a group photo of the participants followed by tea.



Seminar on the “Right to Information”



On the November 11, 2022, Dr. Tahira Tariq from the Department of Media, Art and Design at Greenwich University Karachi Campus organized an awareness seminar on the “Right to Information” in collaboration with Sindh Information Commission.

The seminar started on time at 10:00 am with the recitation of the Holy Quran by Mr. Waqar Ahmed. Mr. Rohail Intekhab welcomed the audience and the distinguished guests of the seminar. The event was hosted by Ms. Afshan.

The first guest speaker Advocate Nadeem Sheikh who is a senior professional lawyer and is working at Sindh High Court. He informed the audience that under Article 19-A of the Constitution, the Right to Information is a fundamental right of every citizen of Pakistan to have the right to have access to information in all matters of public importance subject to

regulation and reasonable restrictions imposed by law. According to him as a citizen of an independent democratic country, it is our responsibility to be vigilant and must know what is happening around us and in our society. In case of any discrepancy found in public records, it is our right to request the information and other relevant details. Linking the right to information with combating corruption and creating good governance he narrated the importance of the law. He also informed the audience that with the help of this law, a large number of complaints have been attended. Further, if someone cannot get any reply to complain within 30 days he can request or file an appeal to the Chief Commissioner. He thanked Greenwich University for organizing such an informative seminar and stressed the need for awareness seminars for the students and the general public.

Guest Speaker Mr. Shahid Jatoi, Information Commissioner of



Sindh Information Commission highlighted the purpose of the Right to Information Act. According to him the purpose of the act is to empower the citizens, promote transparency and accountability in the working of the Government departments, contain corruption, and make our democracy work for the people in a real sense.

The chief guest of the seminar Mr. Nusrat Hussain Chief Commissioner of the Sindh Information Commission informed

the audience that Sindh Information Commission is carrying out its statutory duties in implementing the Right to Access Information Act 2017 since its establishment in 2018. He informed the audience that organizations cannot deny any request for the information and if requested they have to provide information within 30 days. The general public has the right to get any information they need. Further, every organization has to provide information for the public on its website. If information is denied anybody can contact us and launch a complaint. He stressed the need for providing awareness of the law to the general public and congratulated Greenwich University for holding an awareness seminar on the right to information.



Dr. Tahira Tariq thanked the audience for being a part of the awareness seminar. She also thanked Professor Dr. A Q Mughal and the chief guest Mr. Nusrat Hussain for taking out time from their busy schedule for the seminar. She expressed her gratitude to guest speakers Advocate Nadeem Sheikh and Dr. Shahid Jatoti for providing awareness to the audience. Dr. A Q Mughal and Dr. Tahira presented souvenirs to the guests. The seminar ended with a group photo of the guests with the faculty and students followed by refreshments and tea.
