Pindi to have 4 new degree colleges

The government of Punjab has decided to establish four new degree colleges in Rawalpindi in

the next financial year, to meet the escalating demand of higher learning institutions in the city.

According to sources, two degree colleges for boys and two for girls would be set up. Two colleges would be established in Dhoke Ratta and two in Dhamyal.

Reportedly, the estimated cost of these colleges is Rs 140 million.

Sources also said that PC-1 of four degree colleges had been approved, while funds have also been released for Boys Degree College Dhoke Ratta and construction work on the project was expected to start within a month.

60 universities in Pakistan working on robotics technology

Robotics as a discipline of science and technology is being taught at the graduate and post-graduate levels by more than 60 universities of Engineering Science and Technology in Pakistan.

The research and development (R&D) in advanced fields of Robotics and Artificial Intelligence has also been undertaken by some of laboratories established in the R&D institutes and universities in Pakistan. The official in the Ministry of Science and Technology claimed that there is a technical group engaged in the development of automation of industrial processes at the National Institute of Electronics (NIE), Islamabad. The group has developed Programmable Logic Controllers (PLCs), which are used in automatic industrial controls.

ness opportunities for poor women in the Khairpur and Shikarpur districts of Pakistan's Sindh province, devastated by the floods in 2010 and 2011. The project builds on a matching grant and other ongoing development activities of the Flood Emergency Reconstruction Project (FERP). Under the FERP, ADB is assisting Pakistan in reconstructing 790 kilometers (km) damaged national highways and 800 km of provincial roads, bridges, irrigation systems to safer and higher

Textile industries get fire safety training

As many as 150 local textile and garment industries attended a series of fire safety workshops and

Rawalpindi Division Colleges Director Prof Humayun Iqbal confirmed that new colleges would be established in Rawalpindi and Chakwal. He said that the new degree colleges would provide students with the opportunity to study in their hometowns.

Meanwhile, sources told Daily times that the Punjab government had approved PC-1 for establishment of six new degree colleges, including four degree colleges for boys in Rawalpindi.

A girls college would be set up at Karniala, a degree college for boys and another college for girls would be established at Dhamial, a boys college would be set up at Dhok Ratta and one degree college for girls and another college for boys would be established at Dhok Syedan.

More than 50 foreign players have so far signed up for Pakistan's first major Twenty20 league, despite a warning from the international players' association not to take part.

Salman Sarwar Butt, managing director of the Pakistan Super League (PSL), gave the figure and said more overseas players were "likely to sign up shortly", in a Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) statement.

He did not revealed any players' names nor their nationalities but said the overseas interest showed the league, due to start on March 26, was "attractive both in terms of cricket and financial gains".

No international cricket has been played

in Pakistan since militants attacked the Sri Lankan team bus during a Test match in Lahore in 2009 and the country is still rocked by almost daily bombings and shootings.

Adding to the difficulties for the PSL, the head of the Federation of International Cricketers' Associations warned players last week not to take part in the two-week tournament.

Cricket Australia and Cricket South Africa have also hinted they might not allow any players to feature in the PSL.

However, Pakistan last week confirmed South Africans Mike Proctor and Rudi Koertzen along with Zimbabwean Russell Tiffin had signed up as match officials.PCB chairman Zaka Ashraf has offered foreign players insurance worth \$2 million and up to \$100,000 tax free income to play in the league, and Butt insisted in Thursday's statement top-level security would be provided.

"The safety of each and every participant including the audiences is a responsibility that the PSL is not taking lightly," he said.

Organisers were looking at bringing in private firms with "proven credentials" to bolster the security provided by the Pakistani state, he added.

Butt said players will have to seek leave from their home boards to participate, a pre-requisite from the International Cricket Council for Twenty20 leagues around the world.
